

**Report on actions taken by the Rhode Island Ethics Commission
in Executive Session held on January 20, 2026:**

1. Unanimously voted (7-0) to approve the minutes of the Executive Session held on December 16, 2025.
2. Unanimously voted (7-0) in the matter of **In re: Jonathan Pascua**, Complaint No. 2025-2, to find that probable cause does not exist to believe that the Respondent, Jonathan Pascua, an elected member of the Coventry Town Council, violated R.I. Gen. Laws § 36-14-5(a) by his participation in the Coventry Town Council's discussions and votes relating to access to and ownership of the Flat River Reservoir on April 3, 2024, May 2, 2024, and May 9, 2024, and the Town Council's discussions and votes relating to litigation with Soscia Holdings, LLC, on various dates from February 7, 2023, to the present.

Unanimously voted (7-0) in the matter of **In re: Jonathan Pascua**, Complaint No. 2025-2, to find that probable cause does not exist to believe that the Respondent, Jonathan Pascua, an elected member of the Coventry Town Council, violated R.I. Gen. Laws § 36-14-5(d) by his participation in the Coventry Town Council's discussions and votes relating to access to and ownership of the Flat River Reservoir on April 3, 2024, May 2, 2024, and May 9, 2024, and the Town Council's discussions and votes relating to litigation with Soscia Holdings, LLC, on various dates from February 7, 2023, to the present.

3. Unanimously voted (7-0) in the matter of **In re: James Durkin**, Complaint No. 2025-4, to find that good cause exists to grant the Prosecution's Motion to Enlarge Time for Investigation, Second Extension, by 60 days to April 29, 2026.
4. Unanimously voted (7-0) to return to Open Session.
